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Matthew,

Thanks again for your time yesterday and willingness to provide guidance. This email follows-up on my verbal notification to you of Cargill's discovery of what appears to be limited soil staining about 2 feet below surface near the rail road tracks that cross our Lansing, NY property. As we discussed, we were taking soil samples by digging small pits ~3 feet deep and in one of the pits we encountered some staining at ~2' down which had a faint hydrocarbon-like odor that quickly dissipated. It appeared to be historic staining rather than an active spill. There was no free product, and we have no knowledge of, or record of a spill in this area.

We don't believe this is a spill requiring any response but wanted to run this by you/DEC to ensure no further action should be taken.
